### **BEHIND THE BEARD**



Within the Anglican Communion there is a group called GAFCON (Global Anglican Future Conference) which was established in 2008. This group arose in response to theological disputes happening in the Anglican Communion.

Many of the members of GAFCON are from Africa, Asia, and South America. The largest numbers come from Nigeria, Uganda, and Kenya. They represent around half of global Anglicans, which are more traditional in their belief than North America and the UK. Two of the major issues that have been tested the global communion has been sexuality and female ordination (especially female bishops). GAFCON is much more in line with Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy regarding these issues.

Bp. Sarah Mullally has been selected to be the next Archbishop of Canterbury. The position of the Archbishop of Canterbury is not one of authority, the way we might think of the Pope as having authority over all Roman Catholics. Instead, the Archbishop of Canterbury functions as the "first among equals" (among the Primates). The position is meant to be a

symbol of unity for Anglicans worldwide, while not holding authority over any of those primates or bishops. In the Anglican Church of Canada, the highest position of authority is a diocesan bishop.

To select a woman who is in favour of same sex marriage was perceived by GAFCON as rejecting their position in the communion. They have recently declared their distancing from the leadership of the Archbishop of Canterbury (and those in communion with the position of the Archbishop of Canterbury) and have declared themselves a separate entity- "The Global Anglican Communion". Essentially, they are declaring themselves the true Anglican communion, since they believe themselves to be in continuity with historic Anglicanism and they represent the majority of global Anglicans (they probably represent 57% of Anglicans).

### I will include their public letter below:

"To our dear Anglican brothers and sisters in Christ.

Grace and peace to you in the name of our risen Lord Jesus Christ, on the Commemoration of the martyrdom of Hugh Latimer and Nicholas Ridley.

The first Global Anglican Future Conference (GAFCON) gathered in 2008 in Jerusalem to prayerfully respond to the abandonment of the Scriptures by some of the most senior leaders of the Anglican Communion, and to seek their repentance.

In the absence of such repentance, we have been prayerfully advancing towards a future for faithful Anglicans, where the Bible is restored to the heart of the Communion. Today, that future has arrived. Our Gafcon Primates gathered this hour to fulfil our mandate to reform the Anglican Communion, as expressed in the Jerusalem Statement of 2008.

We resolved to reorder the Anglican Communion as follows:

- 1. We declare that the Anglican Communion will be reordered, with only one foundation of communion, namely the Holy Bible, "translated, read, preached, taught and obeyed in its plain and canonical sense, respectful of the church's historic and consensual reading" (Jerusalem Declaration, Article II), which reflects Article VI of the 39 Articles of Religion.
- 2. We reject the so-called Instruments of Communion, namely the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lambeth Conference, the Anglican Consultative Council (ACC), and the Primates Meeting, which have failed to uphold the doctrine and discipline of the Anglican Communion.
- 3. We cannot continue to have communion with those who advocate the revisionist agenda, which has abandoned the inerrant word of God as the final authority and overturned Resolution I.10, of the 1998 Lambeth Conference.
- 4. Therefore, Gafcon has re-ordered the Anglican Communion by restoring its original structure as a fellowship of autonomous provinces bound together by the Formularies of the Reformation, as reflected at the first Lambeth Conference in 1867, and we are now the Global Anglican Communion.
- 5. Provinces of the Global Anglican Communion shall not participate in meetings called by the Archbishop of Canterbury, including the ACC, and shall not make any monetary contribution to the ACC, nor receive any monetary contribution from the ACC or its networks.
- 6. Provinces, which have yet to do so, are encouraged to amend their constitution to remove any reference to being in communion with the See of Canterbury and the Church of England.
- 7. To be a member of the Global Anglican Communion, a province or a diocese must assent to the Jerusalem Declaration of 2008, the contemporary standard for Anglican identity.

8. We shall form a Council of Primates of all member provinces to elect a Chairman, as primus inter pares ('first amongst equals'), to preside over the Council as it continues "to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3).

As I declared in my statement two weeks ago, "the reset of our beloved Communion is now uniquely in the hands of Gafcon, and we are ready to take the lead." Today, Gafcon is leading the Global Anglican Communion. As has been the case from the very beginning, we have not left the Anglican Communion; we are the Anglican Communion. At our upcoming G26 Bishops Conference in Abuja, Nigeria from 3 to 6 March 2026, we will confer and celebrate the Global Anglican Communion.

Please pray that we will lead our Communion in prayerful submission to the Holy Spirit as we hear the voice of Jesus in his wondrous Scriptures, to the glory of God.

The new Canadian Primate responded with this pastoral letter:

'In recent days, primates of the Global Anglican Future Conference announced their decisions to leave the Anglican Communion. In response to this, we, the Primate and the Metropolitans of the Anglican Church of Canada, reaffirm the Solemn Declaration of 1893 found in the (Canadian) Book of Common Prayer:

We declare this Church to be, and desire that it shall continue, in full communion with the Church of England throughout the world, as an integral portion of the One Body of Christ composed of Churches which, united under the One Divine Head and in the fellowship of the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, hold the One Faith revealed in Holy Writ, and defined in the Creeds. (BCP 1959/1962, viii)

We reaffirm the four Instruments of Communion: the Lambeth Conference, the Anglican Consultative Council, the Primates' Meeting, and the primatial See of Canterbury with its people, clergy, and its Archbishop.

We reaffirm the historic Anglican appeal to Scripture, Reason, and Tradition.

The practical and theological question before us is this: Can communion with the Risen Christ contain conflict, so that conflict and disagreement lose their power to divide? We believe the answer to this question is a resounding "YES" because this has been borne out many times in Anglican experience and intuition from the Reformation to the present time.

The Anglican Church of Canada looks forward to participating in the next gathering of the Primates' Meeting, the next meeting of the Anglican Consultative Council, and the next Lambeth Conference. We rejoice in the appointment of Bishop Sarah Mullally as the next Archbishop of Canterbury and will warmly welcome her to Canada after she is installed in 2026.



Many have seen this split as inevitable as the West has continued to embrace Progressive ideas. There are a variety of responses to GAFCON's decision, and it will take time to see what effect this will have. GAFCON has drawn a line in the sand. Some are impatient with them making this decision, thinking that we have had other disagreements in the communion before and are calling for patience. This raises questions about how diverse we can be while still remaining unified. The Anglican communion has always faced divisions. At the time of Oueen Elizabeth, the tensions between Puritan and Catholic were threatening to tear Anglicanism apart. The Elizabethan Settlement allowed them to be Catholic in appearance, but Protestant in doctrine.

The temptation of some in the West is to dismiss GAFCON as being "less advanced" than the West, or as dealing with colonial residue (which diminishes their agency). Their dissent from Western norms is sometimes interpreted as regressive by those in the West, rather than as principled or prophetic. These are our brothers and sisters in Christ, who are seeking to faithfully follow Christ, sometimes in dangerous circumstances, and sometimes experiencing incredible growth. They have an important voice for us to listen to. Unity and healing will require humility, prayer, patience, discernment, and listening.

### **ACORN GROUP**

I've been asked the question, "What is ACORN?" Here's a brief reflection/ explanation. ACORN Groups are an initiative of the Diocese of Calgary. Michael Harvey, of the UK, initiated the practice and has come here (as well as many other places in the world) to teach it. Michael is also the initiator of "Back to Church, Sunday."

ACORN is an evangelistic spiritual practice which emphasizes listening and connecting with God and others.

**Daily:** 

ASK: "Lord, today is there someone you want me to connect with outside the church?"

<u>CALL:</u> We listen for the voice of the Spirit. Does someone come to mind? We pay attention throughout the day. Is there someone God is asking us to help? eg. The person in the grocery line?

OBEY: We make a connection. "How are you?" and if the answer is fine: "How are you really?" And we listen. We listen very carefully. We listen to the person in front of us and the voice of God. Sometimes these conversations are limited. Sometimes they grow into something more. Monthly (some groups in the Diocese meet more often).

<u>REPORT</u> (Testimony): we get together as a group and tell our faith stories. What has happened in the past month as we connected with others?

<u>NOTICE:</u> the others in the group listen intently and notice and magnify the work of God they become aware of.

I personally am drawn to ACORN because I am constantly reminded that I need to slow down and listen. This practice helps me do that.

ACORN Groups meet each month on the last Tuesday (on Zoom at 7PM; the link is the regular Sunday link) and Friday (in person at 10AM in the Charles Hive lounge at St. Leonard's). Feel free to join.



### White Gift Program Adopt-a-Family





There have been some changes to the Salvation Army Adopt-a-Family program. Due to Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) regulations we can not give one family a direct sponsorship, so your gifts will be put in the options of gifts for parents of multiple families to choose from.

"Did the donor ask for the gift to be directed to a specific person, family, or other non-qualified donee. A donor can not choose a specific beneficiary for their gift or ask the qualified donee to give the gift to another non-qualified donee. However, a donor can ask that their gift be used in a particular program of the qualified donee as long as there is no benefit to the donor or anyone not at arm's length to the donor. The qualified donee must be able to use the gift within the particular program as it sees fit. If the donor retains control, the donation is no longer considered a gift at law and a receipt cannot be issued."

The gifts you donate will go into our Gift Room, where parents will personally select presents for their children. This means your donation may help one or several families, depending on the needs. Please do not wrap gifts.

We will not be assigned a specific family as in previous years. This means we will not receive a designated family number. Instead, we will be provided recommendations on the areas where help is most needed, along with a comprehensive list of toy and gift suggestions based on what parents and children have requested.

In addition, we will be looking after a few families within our own Church community, who we call our White Gift Families. We are asking for Gift Cards for families. This makes it much easier for our sorters and allows our families who are being adopted more freedom to be able to purchase items for themselves. All Gifts and Gift Cards must be returned to the Church by Thursday, December 4th.

If you are not able to go out and purchase gift cards or gifts, you may donate money and note on the memo line of your envelope or e-transfer. Krista will shop for you, please let her know if you want to purchase an item or gift card for the White Gifts Families or the Salvation Army Families.

Please drop off your Gift Cards in an envelope in the Church mailbox or in the Offertory Plate on Sundays. This will allow Krista time to sort and organize for the blessing on Sunday, December 7th and the delivery of the items on Thursday, December 11th. Please watch for more information via email, Facebook and the Church Website.

The Salvation Army will issue tax receipts for Gift Cards **over \$20** in total bought for the Salvation Army families. If you are interested in a tax receipt, please contact Krista.


Sadie was Alberta's <u>FIRST FEMALE OPTOPMETRIST</u>. She was very involved in Beta Phi Kappa (Lady of the Year 1992), Soroptometrist Centennial Silent Angel Award (2005), The Red Cross, Westerner, DTRH Palliative Care Program and the Red Deer Hospice. She was very philanthropically—minded and was dedicated to many worthwhile programs including her beloved St. Leonard's.

Within St. Leonard's, Sadie taught Sunday School, was very involved at all levels of the W.A. (now ACW) and she became the <u>FIRST FEMALE</u> member of Vestry (now Parish Council). As an aside, Sadie even learned how to rollerblade at 80!!

Many Church items were also donated in memory of family members e.g. the Stained Glass Cross Box near the front door, the Pulpit, and the Epiphany and Nativity Stained Glass Windows just to name a few.

It was a pleasure to be able to give you a very small snapshot into the lives of two very dynamic parishioners who certainly made a difference at St. Leonard's.






