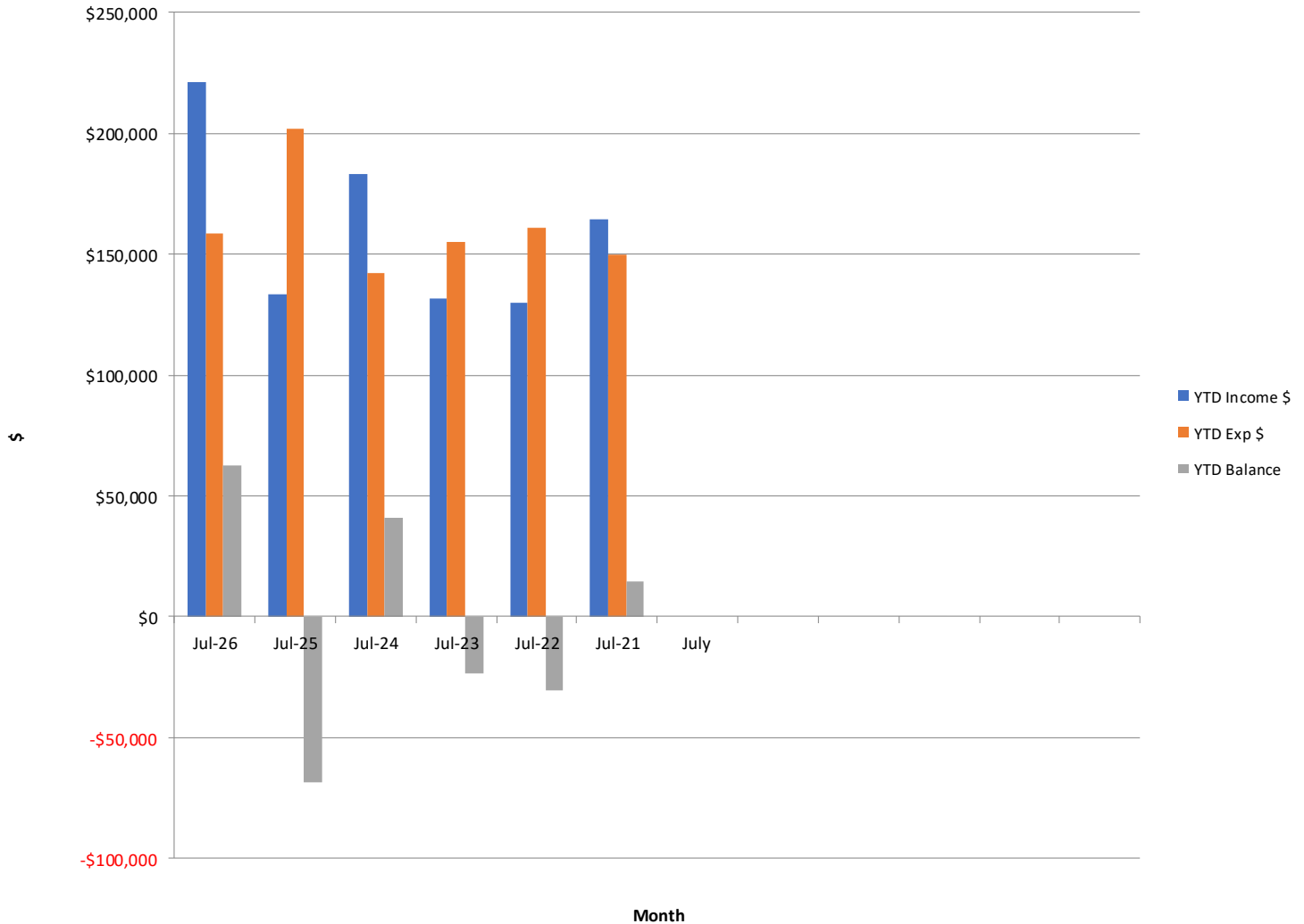

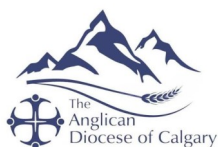

Our Church is Attempting to be a Scent Free Space and we continue to try to honor this.

We are asking those who are donating Church Altar floral arrangements on Sunday to refrain from adding lilies. We have several Church family members who react to the scent of lilies. **At the same time**, please be conscious about shampoo and conditioners, hairsprays, deodorants, colognes and aftershaves fragrances and perfumes, lotions and creams, potpourri, industrial and household chemicals, soaps cosmetics, air fresheners and deodorizers essential oils, candles, diapers, some types of garbage bags, laundry fragrance enhancers and dryer sheets.

It is important to remember some products which claim to be scent free may have only masked the scent by use of an additional chemical. Be sure to research the product carefully if using scented products around those who are sensitive.

Christians around the world are invited to give particular attention to praying and caring for God's creation as part of the global Season of Creation, observed from September 1st to October 4th every year. General Synod 2019 passed a resolution adopting the Season of Creation in the Anglican Church of Canada as a time of prayer, education and action, encouraging dioceses and parishes to participate.

Please Note: To avoid any confusion it is worth noting that the Season of Creation is not a liturgical season like Advent or Easter but rather a time of intentional prayer and reflection.

The Feast may be celebrated on September 1st, to usher in the Season of Creation, or transferred to a Sunday within the season.

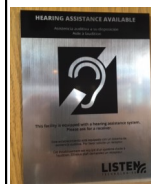


Alongside Hope

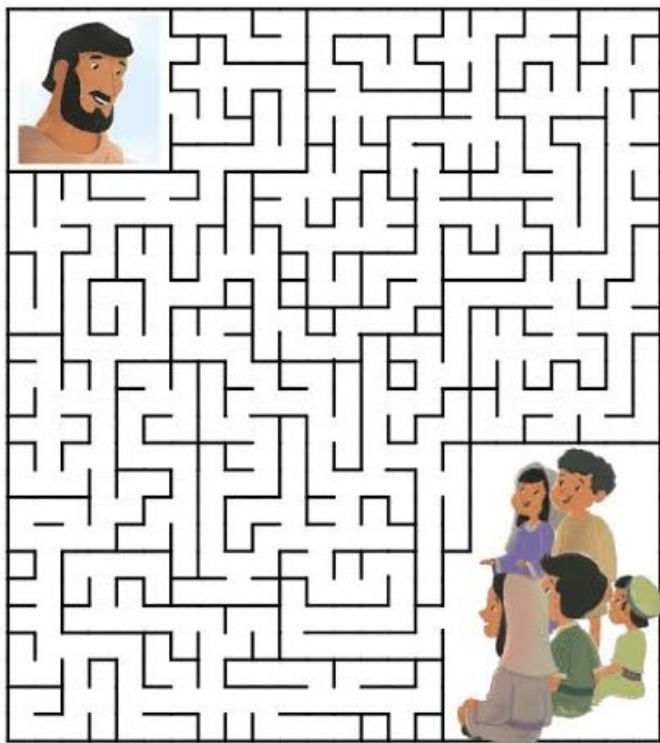

ACORN



What is ACORN?

ACORN is a Diocesan prayer initiative started last spring. It originates with Michael Harvey in the UK (also the originator of "Back to Church Sunday").

Each morning we pray, "Lord, today is there someone you want me to connect with outside the church." That's it: fourteen words. Then we pay attention to what happens...

Sometimes nothing happens. That's ok. A spiritual discipline is still being created. Sometimes the most amazing things happen and we share those faith stories in an ACORN group.

We started ACORN groups in the fall of 2025. We took a break over the summer. ACORN groups will begin again on the last Tuesday of the month: one in- person at St. Leonard's at 10am; the other on Zoom at 7pm. The next ACORN meetings will be on Tues., Sept. 29 th . Please feel free to join. No experience necessary. This fall, the in-person group will be facilitated by Marg Marrett-Julian and the Zoom group by Rev. Fergus.

What does the acronym stand for:

Ask: "Lord, today is there someone you want me to connect with outside the church."

Call: pay attention throughout the day. Who are you being called to speak to?

Obey: ask a simple question, "How are you?" or "How are you, really?"

Report: share your faith stories in a small group.

Notice: the group's job is to notice and encourage.

St. Leonard's has a number of ways of reaching out to each other. Please contact the Office at 403-346- 6769 if you are in need of help or if you are aware of any parishioner needing assistance of some kind.

If you are on St. Leonard's Parish List then your name will be connected to someone on Parish Council. This is the Official Parish List not the ACW List or the Men's Breakfast List but the actual Parish List – if you would like to be on this List please contact the Office.

We have a number of other ways of caring for each other:

We have someone who does hospital visiting. If you or a loved one is hospitalized and would like a pastoral visit, please contact the Office (403-346-6769) or Krista's cell phone number 403-598-7776. That is the only way we can know of this need.

ACW Card Ministry: If you know of someone who could use a little boost of caring please contact the Office and this Ministry will send out an appropriate card (Thinking of you. Glad you're feeling better, or a sympathy card).

Pastoral Care Team: Along with all of these other caring groups, St. Leonard's does have a Pastoral Care Team. This Group will do home visits to parishioners who, for various reasons, need to be personally contacted. If you are aware of someone needing a bit of extra care, please contact the Office.

Krista will direct the information to the right person (it might even be Chris (and/or Barb) as they are very much part of this Team). And again for various reasons it is not always feasible to actually visit some parishioners so they are sent —"Thinking of you" type cards throughout the year.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Each year, September 30th marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The Day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

This Federal Statutory Holiday was created through legislative amendments made by Parliament.

Wear orange!!

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30th.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots Commemorative Day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On September 30th, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.
