## BEHIND THE BEARD



Sometimes it feels as if sorrow is more powerful than joy. Sorrow, fear, and offense seem to grab and hold our attention. I suspect that is why advertisers and news groups use these. We are told we need the newest vehicle so that we have the most up to date safety gadgets- air bags, back up alarms, reinforced body, maybe even a GPS system in case of theft. The news holds our attention with horrible atrocities from all over the world- wars, famines, and diseases. Closer to home we are told stories of awful crimes done to the innocent who are just minding their own business. No wonder parents are less likely to let their children play freely in the neighbourhood. Every passing adult might be a kidnapper. Every stranger knocking on your door might be someone trying to get into your home under false pretenses. Perhaps, standing on your doorstep, is someone trying to sell you a security system to protect you from such people.

I'm not saying there is anything wrong with having a safe vehicle, paying attention to the pain of the world, or being aware of predators. I'm just pointing out how much our focus seems to be drawn by sorrow, fear, and offence.

When I was training to be a chaplain in the hospital, there was an underlying assumption that when someone seemed happy, that was just a mask. Under that mask was deep pain. And it felt like our job was to help them remove that mask (which is a false face they are hiding behind) to reveal their true face, which is the face of profound sorrow. Why did we assume that happiness was less real than sorrow? No doubt there are times when we put on a happy face to cover up our pain, but that can't always be true, can it? Yes, there is much pain in the world. People deal with awful things that happen to them. But there is also a lot of beauty and good in the world.

Easter reminds us that joy, beauty, and peace are more powerful than sorrow. Resurrection will have the last word, not the cross. Mary's tears are overcome by hearing her teacher say her name. Thomas' doubts are overcome by the resurrected Christ inviting Thomas to touch his scars. The ordeal of life is real- we endure much pain in our short years on this planet. We don't want to deny this, but this pain is injected with hope through the reality of the resurrection. Joy is ultimately more powerful than sorrow.

"These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.

They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." (Rev 7:14-17).

I hope to check the Shelves within the next week or so, to see what areas need special attention.



#### **Comments:**

Our April 2022 income of \$40,184 was \$17,342 above expenses. April surplus was largely due to a significant lump sum donation from one parishioner.

February and March 2022 show a deficit because of an increase in utility costs, and the loss of our Federally funded Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy program that we benefited from in 2020 and 2021.


Disciple Nights take place on Sundays @ 7pm via Zoom.

#### **GREEN DEER SPRING CLEAN UP**

As the snow melts away, grass isn't the only thing revealed. Trash and litter that accumulated over winter also become visible. From March 21 to May 31, the Green Deer Spring Cleanup Campaign provides the supplies and resources for all Red Deer residents—of all ages, walks of life, and faiths—to safely pick up litter in their neighborhood.

Of particular importance in 2021 was cleaning up littered pandemic waste—1268 face masks were reported cleaned up by Green Deer volunteers, and the real number is likely many times higher. This trend is sure to continue into 2022, making the Green Deer program more vital than ever.

As a faith community in the Red Deer region, you can put actions to the stewardship and leadership values of your faith by organizing a Green Deer litter cleanup for your congregation and/or by spreading the word and encouraging your community members to participate as individuals and families. Participating in the Green Deer Spring Cleanup Campaign is free and easy! How to get involved:

## PRIMATES WORLD RELIEF DEVELOPMENT FUND

PWRDF has announced that it is now working with a new partner - "Initiative E+". Money given to it will be used for

Ukrainian civilians injured in the war, as well as Ukrainian military personnel.

Since February 24, at the beginning of the conflict, there has been an acute need for medical equipment and supplies to care for those who have been injured. This situation has gone up tenfold. The reality is, of those wounded, 75% are civilians.

By Friday, April 1, PWRDF has now received nearly \$400,000 for humanitarian relief and aid for our Ukrainian sisters and brothers. In March, \$100,000 was given to ACT Alliance, in partnership with Hungarian Interchurch Another \$50,000 was further given to HelpAge Canada which is responding to seniors fleeing Ukraine to a safe haven in Moldova. In addition, PWRDF is pleased to announce that it is giving \$62,000 for medical supplies to Initiative E+ who will be providing care to those in the Kyiv region as well as in Eastern Ukraine. The money will be used for the following:

- Medical equipment for those hospitals which are caring for many injured people
- Medicine for people in Eastern Ukraine as well as in Kyiv and in the surrounding areas
- Ukrainian first responders and military personnel who require PPE and medical supplies

Please continue to pray and to engage in almsgiving for the Ukrainian people in the name of Christ. We are His hands and His feet to care for others. May you be blessed to be a blessing to those in need.

## **HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY**

There is a story about a preacher who had very little of this world's goods. Illness came to his home and he was left sorely in debt. Then a destitute family knocked upon his door. He cared for them and prepared to send them on their way with the last money that he had in his pocket.

As the family was leaving the poor preacher said, " I thank God that you came to me so that I might be of some small help. Thank you so much for coming."

In those words the preacher turned the usual attitude which people have about helping others upside down. When people give you the privilege of helping them, they are giving you the privilege of becoming like God and indeed you owe thanks to God for the opportunity.

The opportunity to help others is a gift God gives to us. One person who comes to my mind as being the most gifted in this way is my Mother. Now I do not want to sound overly sentimental, but the greatest calling which a person can have is not to be a president or a rock star or a TV evangelist; it it the call to be a mother.

The contribution which mothers make cannot be adequately valued. As Anne Taylor wrote:

"Who ran to help me when I fell, And would some pretty story tell, Or kiss the place to make it well. My Mother."

How can we put a dollar figure on what our mothers do and have done for us? We can't. All the more reason then that we should fulfill Proverbs 31: 28, "Her children show their appreciation, and her husband praises her."

Even though we mark one special day each year on which to show our appreciation to our mothers, you and I know that to send flowers on Mother's Day and then, during the rest of the year, to neglect the one who nurtured us, is not really doing what Proverbs says. Every day should be a day on which to say thank you to our Mother for all that she is to us.

Like the young lad who found a lovely crystal earring box at a garage sale. He knew that his Mother would appreciate it. However he was faced with a dilemma: his funds were limited and there were other items which he wanted for himself. Finally he made his decision. His Mother became proud owner of a new earring box.

On Mother's Day we have the opportunity to say thank you for all that our Mother means to us, whether she is here with us or gone to be with the Lord. And Mothers, when you are deluged with the well deserved tokens of affection, remember that your privilege of helping others is a gift to you from God.

Therefore, let us all give thanks to God on Mother's Day.

## Two Horses Lesson's In Life #183

Just up the road from my home is a field, with two horses in it. From a distance, each horse looks like any other horse.

But if you get a closer look you will notice something quite interesting...

One of the horses is blind.

His owner has chosen not to have him put down, but has made him a safe and comfortable barn to live in.

This alone is pretty amazing.

But if you stand nearby and listen, you will hear the sound of a bell. It is coming from a smaller horse in the field.

Attached to the horse's halter is a small, copper-colored bell. It lets the blind friend know where the other horse is, so he can follow.

As you stand and watch these two friends you'll see that the horse with the bell is always checking on the blind horse, and that the blind horse will listen for the bell and then slowly walk to where the other horse is, trusting he will not be led astray.

When the horse with the bell returns to the shelter of the barn each evening, he will stop occasionally to look back, making sure that the blind friend isn't too far behind to hear the bell.

Like the owners of these two horses, God does not throw us away just because we are not perfect. Or because we have problems or challenges.

He watches over us and even brings others into our lives to help us when we are in need.

Sometimes we are the blind horse, being guided by the little ringing bell of those who God places in our lives.

And at other times we are the guide horse, helping others to find their way.




