

## BEHIND THE BEARD



We are now fairly hopeful that we are able to get back to some version of normal. The pandemic restrictions are dropping, and we once again hear the buzz of community in our church building.

In some ways this feels like more than merely opening back up. It feels like rebuilding. I am particularly aware of this when I think about our youth ministries. Teens that were 16 are now 18, so there is no reversing the clock to make Youth Group available for them. Likewise, we are needing to rebuild our Sunday School.

It is a time to not merely go back to everything we used to do, but also to ask what we should be doing. This leads to a deeper question. What does it mean to be the church?

In Matthew 28 Jesus gave the Great Commission-

"And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

So, trusting in the authority of Jesus over all things, we are to make disciples- Apprentices in kingdom living, which is what Jesus was teaching us to be. We are to submerge people into the life of the Trinity. We are to teach people to live all that Jesus has taught us, knowing that he is with us until the job is done.

This is what we are about. All our programs, all of our ministries, all of our groups, are ultimately about this- or they should be. Where we are not in line with this mission, we need correcting. Anything else is ultimately a distraction.

And who is the church? If you believe in Jesus and want to follow him, then the church is you. This commission is your commission. It is my commission. We all have a part to play in this. It will look like many different things depending on who we are with and what aspect of the Kingdom we are dealing with, and that is why God gave us gifts to embody. Sometimes these gifts are to be used within the walls of our church, and sometimes they are to be used outside those walls. It is our responsibility to ask God, "what are you asking me to do as a part of this commission?" What is our part as individuals? What is our part as St. Leonard's, knowing we are a part of a vast movement of Christ followers across the world and throughout time?



## St. Leonard's 2022 Operating Income & Expenses

**Comments:**

Our \$13,019 income for August was \$ 7,357 below our average monthly budget. Our year to date \$38,921 deficit is different than the previous three years average. Over the last 2 years with the Pandemic, St. Leonard's received the Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy that helped offset our payroll expenditures, we no longer receive this from the Federal Government. With the current economy, it is reasonable to say that our donated giving's have changed. We have been conscious of the current climate and have not completed any unnecessary projects during this time. We still hope to have a balanced budget by year end.

Always remember whatever the Season our God walks with us and for that we are truly blessed.



After being side-lined for over two years, the Pastoral Care Ministry is being re-launched!

With Rev. Chris's blessing, we have 8 wonderful volunteers to actively visit parishioners in their homes. They will work together in teams of two. We also have 2 volunteers who can fill in when and where needed for these visits.

Roberta Saltvold will continue taking care of Hospital visits and our Church family members at Ville Marie.

Rev. Chris will be advised of any needs uncovered for his attention.

We have a team of two volunteers who will take care of sending cards to those Church family members for whom an actual visit may not be the most reasonable approach.

Our list of visitees currently number 18 church family members. This is a fluid list as names are added or removed as we go along. We ask that the names of any potential visitees be passed on to Krista, who will inform the team.

The frequency and flavor of the visits will be decided between the visiting team members and their visitees.

The Pastoral Care team will meet regularly to review and assess the progress of this ministry.






## WITH DEEPEST SORROW



## **BLOOD DONORS NEEDED**

Canadian Blood Services has issued an immediate call for new and returning donors to help replenish the blood supply to meet patient needs. The low reserve of blood can be replenished before patients are affected, but only if people across Canada of all blood types donate over the coming weeks.

According to <https://www.blood.ca/en>, the inventory of most blood types is enough for five days or less. One in two people in Canada are eligible to donate blood, plasma, and platelets, but only one in 81 does. A small group of regular donors is meeting the needs of the entire country, which is unsustainable.

The Red Deer Donor Centre at 5020 68 St #5 accepts only blood donations. Many members of St. Leonard's are donors.

Jim Saltvold encourages others who might be eligible, especially younger members, to become regular donors. Jim donates about four times a year and has scheduled his lifetime donation #84 for June.
