

Comments:

Our \$18,927 income for September was \$2,801 below our average monthly budget. Our year to date deficit stands at (\$41,722). Over the last 2 years with the Pandemic, St. Leonard's received the Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy that helped offset our payroll expenditures. As of December 31st, 2021, we no longer receive this from the Federal Government. With the current economy, it is reasonable to say that our donated givings has changed.

We have been conscious of the current climate and have not completed any unnecessary projects during this time. We still hope to have a balanced budget by year end.

Audio/Visual Booth Volunteers Needed



The frequency and flavor of the visits will be decided between the visiting team members and their visitees.


The Pastoral Care team will meet regularly to review and assess the progress of this ministry.

Each Shawl comes with a prayer card. Then they are blessed during a Sunday service.


