

#### BEHIND THE BEARD



Over the last number of Sundays, we have been looking at the topic of Christian Caregiving. How can we care for others as Christians. One topic that would be good to cover if we had more time would be 'boundaries'. I thought it might be good to say something here, since it's something compassionate and helpful people often struggle with.

There is a helpful book by Henry Cloud and John Townsend called "Boundaries" that I found very helpful, and I still go back to periodically. Boundaries have to do with where our responsibility begins and ends, and where another person's responsibility begins and ends. They use the image of backpacks and boulders. We are all responsible for carrying our own backpacks. Backpacks represent our own responsibilities (our emotions, choices, attitudes, talents, and behaviors). "Each one should carry their own load" (Galatians 6:5). Boulders are too big for us to deal with on our own.

Boulders represent things like severe illnesses, the death of a close loved one, a bankruptcy, or severe abuse. These, we need help with. "Carry each other's burdens" (Gal 6:2).

If someone is bothered by our boundaries, that may be an indication that boundaries have been unclear in the past, or that the relationship contains an unhealthy pattern. Change can be difficult.

Taking boundaries seriously means not carrying someone else's backpack, even if it is offered to us. It might seem like the kind thing to do, but if we take on someone else's responsibilities, we will be heading down the road to resentment, burnout, and confusion. Carrying someone else's backpack stops them from maturing by saving them from the consequences of not taking care of their responsibilities. Boulders, on the other hand, we can't deal with on our own. Dealing with boulders on our own can crush us. We need help with boulders.

Setting boundaries can feel selfish (to ourselves, and to those we have to set boundaries with). But this is about being responsible stewards of the resources God has given us. Ultimately, we are accountable to God for what we do and don't do. If we say "yes" to everything, then we are silently saying "no" to many other things. Some of those things might be things God is calling us to do. For example, it might seem generous to empty our bank account to help someone in crisis, but that could jeopardize our ability to care for those God has entrusted to us-like our children. We have limited time, treasure, and energy. Being a good steward means managing these things that have been placed into our lives by God.

Boundaries are not walls. They are gates. Boundaries help us to manage what we are able and called to do, and what we aren't able to do, or aren't called to do. Setting boundaries is about loving others wisely, rather than feeling crushed by trying to meet too many expectations. As Christian caregivers, it's important to know when to say "no", so that we have the space to say "yes".



Our next meeting will be October 13th (Thanksgiving) at 10 am at the Church.



#### <u>Bishop Shane Parker elected 15th Primate</u> <u>of the Anglican Church of Canada</u>

The Rt. Rev. Shane Parker, Bishop of Ottawa, was elected the 15th Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada on June 26, 2025, at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, Ontario, during the 44th session of the General Synod.

Primate-elect Parker has served as the Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Ottawa since 2020. Prior to that, he was Dean of the Diocese of Ottawa and Rector of Christ Church Cathedral in Ottawa for two decades. He has a Master's Degree in Sociology from Carleton University, as well as an honorary Doctorate from Saint Paul University, where he has served as a Part Time professor of Pastoral Ministry and chairs its Anglican Studies Advisory Committee.

The Primate is the spiritual leader of the Anglican church of Canada, the Chief Executive Officer of the Church's national staff team and a member of every national committee, council and board. The Primate represents the Church nationally and internationally.

The Anglican Church of Canada had an acting Primate, Archbishop Anne Germond. Primate-elect Parker was installed in his new role at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, Ontario, on Sunday, June 29th, 2025.



#### **ACORN GROUP**

I've been asked the question, "What is ACORN?" Here's a brief reflection/ explanation. ACORN Groups are an initiative of the Diocese of Calgary. Michael Harvey, of the UK, initiated the practice and has come here (as well as many other places in the world) to teach it. Michael is also the initiator of "Back to Church, Sunday."

ACORN is an evangelistic spiritual practice which emphasizes listening and connecting with God and others.

#### Daily:

<u>ASK:</u> "Lord, today is there someone you want me to connect with outside the church?"

<u>CALL:</u> We listen for the voice of the Spirit. Does someone come to mind? We pay attention throughout the day. Is there someone God is asking us to help? eg. The person in the grocery line?

OBEY: We make a connection. "How are you?" and if the answer is fine: "How are you really?" And we listen. We listen very carefully. We listen to the person in front of us and the voice of God. Sometimes these conversations are limited. Sometimes they grow into something more. Monthly (some groups in the Diocese meet more often).

<u>REPORT</u> (Testimony): we get together as a group and tell our faith stories. What has happened in the past month as we connected with others?

<u>NOTICE:</u> the others in the group listen intently and notice and magnify the work of God they become aware of.

I personally am drawn to ACORN because I am constantly reminded that I need to slow down and listen. This practice helps me do that.

ACORN Groups meet each month on the last Tuesday (on Zoom at 7PM; the link is the regular Sunday link) and Friday (in person at 10AM in the Charles Hive lounge at St. Leonard's). Feel free to join.

- 2. Our Midweek Wednesday Eucharist Services start back on the 17th of September.
- 3. Symposium (September 27th) There are 30 registrants so far. Congratulations to all involved, what a great job so far in putting this together in such a short time.
- 4. Talent Night will need to change the date and time to Saturday, November 22nd from 3-5 pm.
- 5. Picnic- A big success, we had 104 in attendance. Randy came up with a great idea to donate the leftovers to the Mustard Seed. They were very thankful for the gift. Thank you, Colin, for organizing the Picnic and suggesting Balmoral as a place to hold our Church Picnic.
- 6. Marg Marrett and Giovanni met. The next Stewardship Group will meet on Tuesday, September 30th. Time to be determined.




